Daniel Scot was a maths lecturer at Karachi University in Pakistan, but had to flee for his life when he refused to convert to Islam. He settled in Australia and eventually became the minister of a church. A Muslim group took legal action against him under the religious vilification law for criticising Islam at a church seminar in March 2002. Last December, after a long and expensive legal case, he was found to have broken the law. Hear his story and understand why the UK should steer well clear of an 'incitement to religious hatred' law.

Colin Hart, Director of The Christian Institute, will also speak at the meeting. He will give advice on what you can do to oppose the Government's plans.
