<p>4. Christ above culture: The paradox or dualist type</p> <p>Keep the tension between 'now' and 'not yet'. All lawful work has dignity. Enjoy and give thanks for the good things in God's world.</p>	<p><i>"For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come."</i> (Hebrews 13:14)</p> <p>Romans 13:1 (as above)</p> <p><i>"But our citizenship is in heaven.
